They really do care and guide you along a positive way. God has allowed me to keep my business, see my children and set goals. I hit my last bottom, pray with me now! This too shall pass. Luke

The local Chamber of Commerce is showing a lot of interest in the event. We are planning a bedtime snack and early morning coffee before we depart the next morning. We hope you will join us for quite an experience in the open air. The Lord will be with us I know.

The Barbee Group from Community Church

We received a phone call recently from the Barbee Group requesting to provide us with some work. We never imagined what would develop. Three women, five men and nine kids came into our shelter house and did a deep clean like it had never seen before. They scrubbed the walls down, they cleaned under all the furnishings like beds, lockers, cabinets and desks. They cleaned all the corners and base boards, they cleaned the shower rooms and fixtures and the rest rooms. When they left the place smelled brand new again. They acted like they really enjoyed the experience and even said they wanted to come back and do it again in a few months. Thank you Community Church for this great gift, with a great spirit, you have presented us with. This truly is God speaking to the Community.
