All by my son's Father. This man went as low as to steal his son's WIC Card, the little and only help I had at the time. So of course when I would lose a job due to his harassment, my finances started to diminish. Formula, food, diapers, clothes for my son and the rest of just the simplest things became priority over things like bills for a time.

I had stayed with a couple of friends for a very short time but ultimately, since I've finally gotten away from my son's Father, it was time to start completely newsomewhere new. So I made the decision to move to Lancaster. The Foundation Shelters has kept me and my son safe and with a clean, warm bed at night. It has allowed me to not worry about where we were going to lay our heads at night so I could go out and do what I needed to do to get back on my feet. I am so thankful and appreciative beyond words This place and its volunteers are definitely here for a reason. And they help so many like me and my son. I am forever Grateful. Sincerely, Barbara
