I was calling places in each and every town, Athens, Hocking, Fairfield, and Franklin. I was then given a number from Hocking for a Homeless Shelter. Some place I'd never been and was scared to go. I set in my storage shed all day wondering what I should do. So I call the number on the paper from Hocking Co. There I spoke with a gentle man who was very nice. He told me to be there at the Westside Shelter about 8:00pm. So I did. I was assigned to the building where I met with a women named Kate. She takes care of the homeless women. They are in the building on one side and the men are in the building on the other side. I have been here about
