ONE OF OUR GREAT INNKEEPERS

My name is Lowell Trimmer, one of three InnKeepers at The Foundation Shelters. I served in the Navy from 1950-54 during the Korean "Conflict". I have 5 sons, 4 of them also served in the military. Three were in the Marines, one in the Army. The remaining son also joined the Army but was sent home after they discovered that he had a hernia. My youngest son was in the service during Desert Storm. He was a Sergeant and part of a patrol trained for a land invasion up the Gulf. His letters stated they would soon be going ashore to "engage" the enemy.

The wife and I were naturally concerned for his safety. We did a lot of praying and crying. At the time I was driving school bus for the city of Logan. When there were no kids on my bus, I sang (many times) these words, which I made up. Singing the following words helped me get through that terrible time. I quote-

"Don't worry, be happy-its written in His Word. Trust Jesus, he loves you, I'm sure you've heard. He'll take you through the troubled times, He'll ease your mind.- So don't worry, be happy-right.now is the time."

As it turned out, he and his men did not have to go ashore. God works in mysterious ways, His wonders to behold. Thank you Lord.

Lowell has been with us for several years. Lowell is a member of The 5th Avenue Church of Christ. He oversees the Shelter for three nights each week. He is as faithful to be there as can be. He is a dedicated Christian who truly cares for the homeless that he takes care of all night. We are happy that he chose us for his retirement employment. Ed
